- Previously was covering 'the back half' of the Newspaper, supervising the coverage of business, finance and science.
- Spent time away from *The Economist* (from 2000) to work at the *Financial Times* where he was foreign news editor and latterly news editor overseeing the front page and the newspaper.
- Moved to Paris in 1995 to write on *The Economist's* European business and then back in London as Business Editor.
- First joined *The Economist* as Science Correspondent in 1987, going on to write on a wide range of issues including electronics and telecoms, trade, energy and the environment.
- Studied science at Cambridge University, winning *The Bronowski Prize* for his work on 18th Century French Chemistry.
